

Make Sure Your Child Is Safe



- 1. The different things you will need to do to keep your child safe depend on how old they are and what type of trouble they can get into.
 - Kids are curious and like to challenge rules, so be prepared to keep them safe.
- 2. Even though your child may learn a new skill, he or she may not be able to consider dangers with what he/she is doing.
 - A toddler doesn't understand what will happen when he falls off the table he just climbed up on.
- 3. Here are some guidelines you can use to help keep your child safe:
 - Infants:
 - Put all possible hazards up high and out of view. Only have safe objects around your child.
 - Always use car seats when your baby rides in a car.

Toddlers & Preschoolers:

- Use fun ways to teach safety, like with pictures, songs, and books.
- Always explain why your child is not allowed to do something. Let him/her know what
 the consequences will be if they break the rules ("If you climb, you will fall," instead of
 "Don't do that!").
- Watch TV with your child; talk about how fake TV is when compared to real life. Answer any questions about what he or she is watching (like when a cartoon shows someone flying, blowing up, or wrecking a car and then walking away from it).

School Age:

- Always give your child specific safety rules.
- Encourage them to ask questions.
- Have them point out unsafe things around them.
- Use picture games to help them to identify unsafe things.
- Do role-playing to teach them what to do in unsafe situations.
