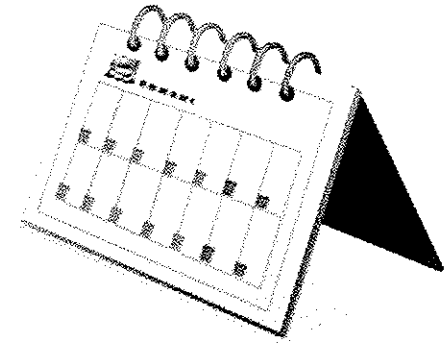

Camp ISD is OPEN to parents of Illinois children who are deaf or hard of hearing entering 3rd through 10th grade in the fall 2014. Parents participate in two days of fun and learning while their children attend one of the many summer camps offered at ISD between June 15-20, 2014.



Camp ISD is FREE! Parents will stay in the ISD dormitories, eat in the ISD dining room, and participate in lectures and activities separate from their children.

Camp ISD is EDUCATIONAL! Parents will attend sessions relevant to raising children who are deaf or hard of hearing, in a relaxed, friendly atmosphere. Session topics may include:

The Illinois School for the Deaf (ISD) is offering a sports camp for children who are deaf or hard of hearing. 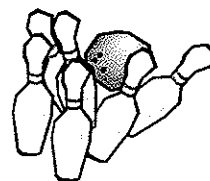
GOAL

COST

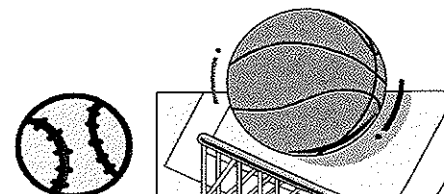
There is a \$13.00 fee to cover the cost of a camp T-shirt. Children should also bring \$30 spending money.

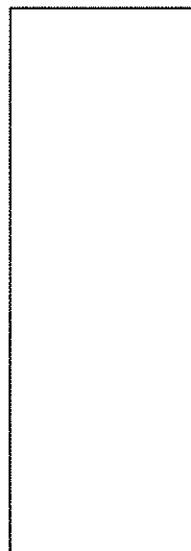

CAMP 2014

The Illinois School for the Deaf (ISD) is offering a Creative Arts Camp for children who are deaf or hard of hearing and reside in IL. ISD is located on a 55 acre campus in Jacksonville, Illinois and has excellent facilities with a well-stocked art classroom, deaf-friendly classrooms, two computer labs and various classrooms for ASL activities. Participants will live in dormitories with two to a room on the ISD campus, eat meals in the cafeteria and practice various arts in various classrooms. The camp will open on Sunday June 15th after 1:00 p.m. and close at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, June 20th.

GOAL

The camp's goal is to provide the participants the opportunity to improve communication and socialization skills while learning dance, art, technology and ASL expression.



Deadline for applying for the camp is May 16, 2014.

CAMP ACTIVITIES

During the day, participants will be taught a dance routine, create a mixed media art project, learn how to develop designs on a computer and participate in ASL expression activities. During the evenings, various recreational activities will be offered. An exhibition program will be held on Friday, June 20th, beginning at 11:00 a.m. followed by lunch at 12:00 p.m. in our Huff Dietary.
