

The Americans with Disabilities Act:



- 1. The ADA is a federal law that prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities.
- 2. The areas that are affected by the ADA include employment, public services (schools), public accommodations, and services run by private entities and telecommunications.
- 3. All people with physical and mental disabilities are protected by the law.
- 4. How will this affect your daily life?
 - Barriers to buildings must be removed.
 - Employers must make reasonable accommodations. •
 - Modifications must be made so everyone can enjoy public accommodations. •
 - All new construction must be accessible.
 - Readily-accessible transportation for people with disabilities (Para-transit services) must be provided whenever possible.
 - If places like hotels offer transportation, they must offer equal transportation to people with disabilities.
 - Telephone companies must offer services to people using telecommunication devices for the deaf (TTY).
