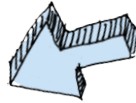
Call us at (800) 322-3722 to apply.

We partner with Illinois families and communities to help children and youth with special healthcare needs connect to services and resources.

Who we help



University of Illinois at Chicago - Division of Specialized Care for Children helps children who are residents of Illinois and have certain chronic, treatable conditions.

How we help



Our care coordination is available regardless of income. Based on your needs, we can support you in the following areas:

- accessing free diagnostic tests
- finding specialized medical care
- using insurance and All Kids/Medicaid
- finding resources & information
- developing a care coordination plan
- communicating with doctors, schools & specialists
- preparing for transition

To qualify for financial assistance, you must meet our income guidelines. Our financial assistance helps cover payment for specialized medical treatment such as surgery, medication, therapy, wheelchairs and hearing aids.



Is my child eligible?

We help children with conditions in the following categories:

- Cardiac Impairments
- Cystic Fibrosis
- Eye Impairments (Cataract, Glaucoma, Strabismus)
- External Body Impairments (Cleft Lip and Palate, Craniofacial Anomalies)
- Hearing Impairments
- Hemophilia
- Inborn Errors of Metabolism (Phenylketonuria [PKU])
- Nervous System Impairments (Seizures, Nerve, Brain, Spinal Cord)
- Orthopedic Impairments
- Speech Impairments (Dysarthria, Vocal Cord Paralysis)
- Urinary System Impairments

If you have health insurance or All Kids/Medicaid, we'll help you understand your benefits so you get the most out of your plan. If you don't have coverage, we'll help you apply for All Kids/Medicaid - an Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) insurance program that provides medical insurance for children ages birth to 18.
