



Purpose

Where & When

Three camps will be held June 11-15 2024. All camps will be held on the ISVI campus in Jacksonville, Illinois, west of Springfield on Interstate 72.

Who May Attend

Students who are visually impaired, ages 9–19, are eligible to attend the camp if they reside in Illinois, do not currently attend ISVI, are not high school graduates, and have appropriate independent living skills.

Transportation

Families are responsible for providing transportation to ISVI and we will provide transportation home to a designated drop off location near you.

Tours

Tours will be available before or after Registration on June 11th by appointment only. Please call 217-479-4404 if you would like to tour the campus.

Note: A physical is required and must be dated within 12 months of application. A sports physical is also required if student would like to participate in sport activities.

Students will problem solve strategies using math, science, art and music skills, integrating technology and engineering, and team building with sports.


Transition to Independence
